- Since joining the NACO Drug Discount Card Program, there has been a savings of \$70,000 for the citizens of the County
- Audit - Both auditing firms have been here doing the initial phase of the audit and will be back in October to finish up
- Cost Savings - After a comprehensive review of our General Liability and Auto Insurance prior to renewal, we were able to correct oversights/make updates that will save the County more than \$7,500 in premiums this fiscal year
- Grayson County Landfill Closure Update - Two probes at the Landfill have been replaced we've had satisfactory soil and gas reading on all four of our probes.

The next readings will be conducted this month and we're optimistic that we will continue to have satisfactory readings.

- HAZMAT Certification - In the ongoing effort to be Emergency Response Ready, we are sending four of our key staff to the Commonwealth of Virginia's Chemical Spill Response Training this month. In order to receive our HAZMAT Certification, we are required to have four (4) of our staff receive the important training. Jimmy Moss, Hazmat Coordinator, Mitch Smith, Emergency Services Coordinator, Jonathan Luper, Director of Public Works, and Kenny Wilson, Director of Maintenance, will be representing Grayson County.
- Certification – Our Building Official, James Moss, was issued a recertification on July 19th, 2012 (Residential Energy Inspector).
- Green Government Initiative-Recycling - Grayson County Recycling now has a recycling convenience center at the Providence School/Fries Fire Department. This is the fifth convenience center we have placed throughout the county. The first is here in the Town of Independence, the second was set at the Elk Creek Fire Dept., the third was set off in the Town of Fries, the fourth was located in Fairview Elementary School and the fifth is now resting at the Providence School House/ Fries Fire Dept. We have another convenient center almost ready to place and are looking at making the next roll off of at the Baywood Elementary School.

(The first six months we donated it to Virgil Moore of V&M Recycling and we still have outstanding accounts receivable, so we don't have the monetary translation at this time.)

But FY 13 we will have 12 months of receipts for the sale of our recycs.

We have crossed the 200 bails mark for plastic, cardboard and paper. We have approximately 40 bails in storage waiting for prices to recover a bit before we sell.

- Large Item – 2012 Large Item pick-up yielded 126.56 tons collected throughout the county including 3,200 car tires which cost the county approximately \$26,664.77.
- Wireless Board Decision - The Commonwealth had been accepting overpayments from Grayson County and other jurisdictions for E-911 communication services since FY 2010. Our Regional 911 Director, Jolena Young, armed with letters of support from Grayson, Carroll and the City of Galax, attended the Wireless Board meeting and helped facilitate a positive resolve. The Wireless Board will repay the approximately \$395,000 to the Twin Counties over the next five years by providing our 911 Center with an additional \$35,000 per year and a one-time payment of \$220,000. The \$220K will be utilized for needed communication equipment upgrades to the center. The \$35,000 a year will supplant a portion of each member jurisdictions annual contribution or needed increases for the next 2-5 years.
- VDOT Maintenance Concern Forms – Multiple Maintenance Concern Forms have been submitted to VDOT since June.

- ADA Compliance Improvements – We have completed all of our sidewalk repairs that meet ADA standards and would be OSHA approved here at the courthouse. We made 18 repairs totaling 817 sq ft of sidewalk panels using a patented technology to saw cut the uneven portion of the sidewalk. Using this technology versus the traditional tare our and replace approach saved us an estimated \$7,124. (Total Cost \$1,046). Also, a new pad was poured behind to accommodate a generator for times of emergencies when we have loss of power. The wiring and switch gear has already been installed. The generator (formerly supplied power to a U.S. Army camp) was purchased at the state surplus store. The wiring, switch gear and hook-up materials were paid for through a VDEM Grant.
