IN RE: CONSENT AGENDA

Brenda Sutherland made the motion to approve the consent agenda; duly seconded by John K. Brewer. Motion carried 4-0.

IN RE: REPORTS, PRESENTATIONS OR REQUESTS

Mr. Zach Olinger, with the Mathews State Forest of the Virginia Department of Forestry, presented a check to the Board for \$1,638.30 which is 25% of money generated on our state forest land here in Grayson County.

IN RE: SCHOOL BOARD MONTHLY REQUISITION

Brenda Sutherland moved to approve the appropriation of the School Board's monthly allocation in the amount of \$392,698.53 (1/12) for the month of July, 2013 and \$392,698.53 (1/12) for the month of August, 2013; duly seconded by David M. Sexton. Motion carried 4-0.

RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT

DAY OF SERVICE

WHEREAS, the governors of Virginia, Maryland and West Virginia and the mayor of Washington, D.C., have come together to support "Day to Serve"; and

WHEREAS, "Day to Serve" is a unique event that has inspired a diverse group of people of our large region to set aside their political, religious, and cultural differences to strengthen our collective communities by coming together to "feed the hungry, protect and enhance the environment, as well as strengthening our communities"; and

WHEREAS, the governor of Virginia has issued a proclamation encouraging all citizens of Virginia to participate in a "Day of Service", between September 15-29, 2013; and

WHEREAS, during the inaugural "Day to Serve" in 2012, this remarkable and unprecedented event swept from the state capital to local churches, schools, neighborhoods and families and resulted in over 750 community events with more than 14,000 volunteers, culminating in 26,000 hours of service rendered, resulting in over 600,000 pounds of food being donated to local food banks; and

IN RE: APPOINTMENTS

Chairman-Grayson County Board of Supervisors

- Brenda Sutherland nominated Kenneth R. Belton; duly seconded by Kenneth R. Belton. John K. Brewer nominated Brenda Sutherland; Mrs. Sutherland declined the nomination. By acclamation nominations were closed. Motion carried 4-0 for Kenneth R. Belton to be Chairman of the Grayson County Board of Supervisors and fulfill the remainder of Thomas "Mike" Maynard's term.

Vice Chair-Grayson County Board of Supervisors

- Kenneth R. Belton nominated Brenda Sutherland; duly seconded by John K. Brewer. By acclamation, nominations were closed. Motion carried 4-0 for Brenda Sutherland to be the Vice Chair of the Grayson County Board of Supervisors.

Rooftop of Virginia Board of Directors-Alternate

- John K. Brewer made the motion to hold off on the remainder of board appointments which include: Rooftop of Virginia Board of Directors – Alternate; Chief Local Elected Officials Consortium (CLEOs); Planning Commission-Board of Supervisors Representative; Workforce Investment Board (WIB); and Blue Ridge Crossroads Economic Development Authority (BRCEDA); duly seconded by David M. Sexton. Alternate motion amended to defer the above appointments with the exception of Emergency Services Director by John K. Brewer; duly seconded by David M. Sexton. John K. Brewer rescinded his motion; duly seconded by David M. Sexton; then added Carroll-Grayson-Galax Solid Waste Authority (CGGSWA) to the motion; duly seconded by David M. Sexton. Motion carried 4-0.

Emergency Services Director

- David M. Sexton nominated Kenneth R. Belton; John K. Brewer closed nominations; duly seconded by David M. Sexton; motion carried 4-0. David M. Sexton made the motion to approve Kenneth R. Belton; duly seconded by Brenda Sutherland. Motion carried 4-0.

Carroll-Grayson-Galax Solid Waste Authority (CGGSWA)

- John K. Brewer made the motion to nominate David M. Sexton; duly seconded by David M. Sexton with the votes being 2 ayes and 2 nays. Brenda Sutherland made the motion to nominate Mitch Smith; duly seconded by Kenneth R. Belton with the votes being 2 ayes and 2 nays. This appointment will stay on the appointment list until filled.

Grayson Board of Supervisor – Wilson District Representative

- Jonathan D. Sweet read the Virginia Code (§ 24.2-228. *Interim appointment to local governing body or elected school board; elected mayor*) on making this appointment within 45 days and the Board unanimously voted not to exercise their right of appointment to fill the Wilson District seat left vacant through the passing of Mr. Maynard. Mr. Sweet will communicate their decision to the Judge.

IN RE: COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Jonathan D. Sweet presented the following report:

- Southeast RCAP (Providence School) - The County had made a request and was successful in receiving Technical Assistance from Southeast RCAP for the Providence School's septic system project. Mr. Larry Wallace, SERCAP's Virginia State Program Manager has been working with the Health Department and the Fries Volunteer Fire Department on salvaging as much of the existing drain field as possible and looking to resourcefully make the necessary system improvements in the most economically feasible way possible.
- Lead Meter Replacement Project – This project consists of replacing approximately 500 meters in response to notice of Public Law 111-380 (Reduction of Lead in Drinking Water Act that will take effect in January 2014. The proposed public safety and infrastructure improvement project is expected to have a total cost of \$160,000. Staff feels confident that the project will satisfy current and future water quality and safety concerns with respect to metering within the greater part of our water system. Additionally, the improvements will allow the county to operate a more efficient system with a greater ability to capture revenues from low-flow usage and vastly enhance our meter reading capabilities. We were successful in receiving \$80,000 in grant funds for construction from the Southwest Virginia Regional Water/Wastewater Fund.
- Nuckolls Curve Road Waterline Extension Project – The project located in the Providence District consists of a 5,900 linear foot extension of the existing system to serve 40 new potential customers/citizens. Driving the project is the current conditions of water quality; well proximity to septic systems; and a partner with Matthew State Forest to service their improvements with a long-term reliable water source and adequate capacity for fire flow and future growth needs. We were successful in receiving \$20,000 in Technical Assistance Funds for this project to engage in a PER.
- Virginia Carolina Water Authority – The Virginia Department of Health's Office of Drinking Water has approved the Virginia/Carolina Water Authority's Water Treatment Plant's Intake Expansion project following the results of their 48-hour yield and drawdown test as part of their recently expanded riverbank infiltration gallery, with a safe yield of 701 gallons per minute. The Waterworks Operation Permit has now been updated to reflect the improvements and the additional gallery has been approved and placed into service.
- Grayson County Storm Water Management Program – Pursuant to Sec. 10.1-603.3A of the Code of Virginia, Grayson County is required to comply with the Provisions of the Storm Water Management Act which includes the implementation of a local Storm Water Management Program to be developed per VSMP Standards as evaluated by the

department of Environmental Quality. After the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board reviewed the status of the progress Grayson County has made in adopting a local storm water management program, we were successful in our request and have been granted a 12-month extension to our local adoption deadline. This now gives us until June 13, 2014 to effectively adopt and implement a local program.

- Economic Development – Mr. Sweet hosted the Director of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, Mr. Martin Briley, on a Grayson County Industry Tour on location at McAllister Mills, prior to participating in our BRCEA Legislative Briefing, where Mr. Briley served as the keynote speaker in sharing with us his professional opinion and prognostications on the state of the economy in the Commonwealth. The industry tour yielded the opportunity to potentially link McAllister Mills up with CCAM, the Commonwealth’s Center for Advanced Manufacturing, and Mr. Sweet is currently working on making that connection.
- Personnel – Brad Chambers has joined the County Team as our new part-time Animal Control Officer. He will serve the county as an Animal Control Officer in a relief capacity to our full-time Animal Control Officer. Our Director of Parks and Recreation, Keith Weatherman, has tendered his notice to discontinue his employment following the acceptance of a new position with the River North Correctional Facility. We are currently advertising the vacancy through the County Website, the Virginia Employment Commission and advertisements in both local newspapers, the Gazette and Declaration. The position will remain opened until filled.
- Rt. 94 Road Closure – Currently there are two contractors as well as VDOT crews working at different locations to make repairs on the roadway. One site is the repair of the slide area and others include areas of the roadway that have cracked and have the potential to slide. They are working to stabilize those areas before that happens. The road is closed to through traffic. During working hours, the contractors have heavy equipment in the roadway which does not allow opening the roadway to through traffic. Also, until the road is repaired and stabilized it is unsafe for citizen’s to travel on. They cannot enforce the closure after normal working hours and should someone drive around the road closures they are risking their safety as well as breaking the law, as the road is closed for the safety of the public. They are working to get the road repaired as soon as possible and are hoping to have it opened to traffic by August 16th, 2013.
- The Grayson Youth Live-Stock Show – Will be held Saturday, August 17th, 2013 at the old Elk Creek School.

IN RE: DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS
