IN RE: VRS VOLUNTARY GROUP LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE PROGRAM ADOPTION AGREEMENT

Mr. Shepley deferred to Mrs. Gayheart for explanation. Mrs. Gayheart explained that this is a new opportunity for the County employees (information listed below). The State has opened this up for all employees, not just state employees, to participate in this voluntary program. It will allow county employees to sign up for long term care benefits at no cost to the county. The Board will have to adopt this in order for the employees to participate. Supervisor Sutherland made the motion to approve; duly seconded by Supervisor Revels. Motion carried 5-0.

The Virginia Retirement System (VRS) administers the Commonwealth of Virginia (COV) Voluntary Group Long Term Care Insurance Program, which is underwritten by Genworth Life Insurance Company.

As an employer that has not previously elected to participate in the program, you may wish to consider doing so during an employer election period open now through June 14. If you elect to participate in the program, eligible actively-at-work employees under age 66 may apply for coverage with reduced medical underwriting during a special fall enrollment, September 16 to October 11.

Actively-at-work employees who work at least 20 hours a week, and select family members ages 18 through 75 are eligible to apply for the COV Voluntary Group Long Term Care !nsurance Program. Mr. Bolt also noted that several citizens in the county have contacted him regarding a letter from Better Land Company LLC out of northern Virginia making offers on land. They make extremely low offers on land; Mr. Bolt suggested throwing the letter away – what they are doing is legal, they are just offering extremely low prices on land.

Mr. James Hayes spoke and invited everyone to attend the Ramp Festival in Whitetop next Sunday.

IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING

- TO RECEIVE PUBLIC COMMENTS REGARDING AN APPLICATION THAT HAS BEEN FILE WITH THE USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO PURCHASE SHERIFF DEPARTMENT VEHICLE & EQUIPMENT

Sheriff Richard Vaughan spoke regarding this grant. Approximately every three (3) years a grant is available from Rural Development for a vehicle and equipment for the vehicle. Rural Development completes the application and this year it's for \$25,000 with a \$10,000 match required which the Sheriff's Department has budgeted for it. We've had really good success in the past in acquiring the grants and feel confident this year will be no different.

Supervisor Revels made the motion to open the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Hash. Motion carried 5-0.

Supervisor Revels made the motion to close the public hearing since no one signed up to speak; duly seconded by Supervisor Hash. Motion carried 5-0.

Supervisor Hash made the motion to approve; duly seconded by Supervisor Revels. Motion carried 5-0 to proceed.

IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING

- PUBLIC HEARING TO RECEIVE PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THE PROPOSED GRAYSON COUNTY VDOT SECONDARY SYSTEM

Supervisor Fant made the motion to open the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Sutherland. Motion carried 5-0.

- ➤ David Rutherford of Little River Road stated that this road needs tar & gravel & several places need to be widened due to lots of traffic (logging trucks/farm trucks/trailers concerned about safety as well.
- ➤ Jack Shrewsberry of Cornerstone Road read a letter from Darrell Taylor of Cornerstone Road who moved there in 1997, there are 18 different residential homes and lots of traffic; concerned about the dust/potholes. Mr. Shrewsberry noted that the road is terrible and now we're lucky to get the mowing along the road done now.

- ➤ Richard and Opal Carrico sent in a letter that Supervisor Belton read stating that they have lived on Cornerstone Road for 20 years stating they have seen the road deteriorate with potholes and an increase in traffic is worse now and safety for buses is also a concern.
- ➤ Roger Billings of Pleasant Grove Road spoke representing the folks on the lower end of Pleasant Grove Road noting that he's been to the Board several times in the last year and half. To recap, back in October 2018 and VDOT's final recommendation is to put in one (1) mile in the 6-year plan to update the road approximately four (4) feet everywhere which VDOT already has the right-of-ways. I built there on Pleasant Grove Road over 30 years ago and this road was in the 6-year plan then and I've lived through five (5) 6-year plans. Any consideration from the Board and VDOT would be greatly appreciated.
- Adelaide Devine of Cornerstone Road spoke seconding what Mr. Billings stated and also noted that she's had to repair her driveway twice.
- ➤ Jeff Wilson of Shale Hollow Ln spoke hoping Shale Hollow Ln used to be on the 6-year plan but found out today that they are no longer on the 6-year plan and is coming forward asking for it to be placed back on the 6-year plan to get that road fixed.
- ➤ Tom Simpson of Two Rivers Dr (of off Pleasant Grove Road) spoke that there are more than 150 seasonal and full-time residents and would like to see it placed on the 6-year road plan they road is really narrow, and safety is a main concern. There are four (4) culverts that are washed out plus this is a devalue of property value.
- ➤ Debbie Hash of River Hill Lane which is off of Pleasant Grove Road and been a resident there for 33 years. Currently there is 18 homes, 104 river lots plus a campground. Traffic count in 2014 showed 200 cars per day which is a lot of vehicles on a dirt road daily. There are a lot of oversized vehicles on this road plus the school bus travels this road daily. Requesting one (1) mile of Pleasant Grove Road beginning at Rt. 58 (Veterans Bridge) to be widened and paved to make the road safe. We would also like to add it to the 6-year plan and also that is be prioritized for the safety of not only the ones traveling the road daily but for all travelers. Also thanked Jeff Russell and VDOT for all the work that they do.
- ➤ Jeff Roberts of Whitehead Street/Sparta/NC (has a river lot on Pleasant Grove Road) spoke and noted that he's had a lot there on the river since 1985. Since then they have seen numerous accidents, lots of potholes and some of the banks have given away and would like to see guardrails and/or improvements to the road before someone really gets hurt.
- Danny Petty of Rock Chimney Road spoke regarding safety concerns on Pleasant Grove road. Recommended have more turnouts for pulling off and possibly some guardrails.
- ➢ Bill Carico spoke regarding Pleasant Grove Road − not safe and need more pull offs.

- Charles Hall of Beagle Lane spoke regarding Beagle Lane road stating that more traffic now with school kids (which meets the bus at his driveway for pickup & drop-offs)
- ➤ Jackie Reeves was signed up, but Mr. Russell spoke with him outside and Mr. Reeves said to say thanks and he was going home.

Mr. Jeff Russell of VDOT addressed the board. In answer to some of the questions that has been posed:

- o Little River Road is currently on the plan (2.3 miles) and is probably all that qualifies Mr. Russell will look at the left side to see if it qualifies.
- Cornerstone Road does qualify as rural rustic from Graystone Road down to a sharp bend – about 1.4 miles; the remainder from the sharp bend out to Rt. 21 does not qualify as rural rustic due to sheer size of the embankments, etc.
- Shale Hollow Ln may qualify to be a rural rustic road but Mr. Russell will have to take a look to be certain
- Recommending adding Pleasant Grove Road (1.3 miles) spot widening not sure if it can be hard surface just widening; and Beagle Lane (1.2 miles) to the 6-year road plan which pretty well exhausts the allocations for this year
- Supervisor Fant inquired about the culverts and safety issues on the roads Mr.
 Russell noted that VDOT should be looking at those on regular maintenance.
- Supervisor Belton inquired about the guardrail on Delhart Road and Mr. Russell noted they are doing a traffic study now and should be able to use the county safety and operational funds that VDOT gives out; hoping to install the guardrail as well as directional signage at that one location
- Supervisor Belton thanked Mr. Russell for all his hard work and for helping Grayson County as much as possible.

Supervisor Fant made the motion to approve the resolution (listed below) on the Six-Year Road Plan; duly seconded by Supervisor Revels. Motion carried 5-0.

Supervisor Fant inquired about this upcoming year. For example, Churchview Lane looks like its on the 6-year plan. Mr. Russell noted that \$37,500 is allocated and once the ones above it on the list (listed in priority order) are completed, then they'll move on down the list. Mr. Russell also explained for example, Wallens Creek Rd that the estimated cost is \$212,000; \$2,000 from previous funding and there is \$210,000 additional funding required; \$77,476 will be added 2019-20 and \$132,524 will be added in 2020-21 and will be fully funded.

Supervisor Fant made the motion to open the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Hash. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Shepley spoke giving an overview of what the county is doing this year and where things stand in this fiscal year. The County is 75% through this current year and we've spent about 75% of what has been allotted and noted the following:



CHALLENGES

- New River Valley Regional Jail
- Child Services Act mandated financial support of eligible children in need of support services
- Juvenile Detention

FUNDING PRIORITIES FOR FY2020

- Sustain a sound financial position using revenue & spending adjustments
- Adequately fund public education
- Set the conditions for broadband expansion
- Expand accessibility to healthcare
- Fund economic development
- Preserve and grow the volunteer fire and rescue system
- Preserve county assets through the capital improvement plan
- Maintain employee benefits with adequate modifications

TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

- Elderly or disabled citizens may apply for up to \$250 in real estate tax relief as long as certain criteria are met including the following:
 - Annual income of \$27,500 or less
 - Net worth of \$90,000 or below excluding house and one acre of land

(2019 Deadline for application to the program extended to June 30, 2019)

Mr. James Hayes, Whitetop, Virginia, spoke regarding the tax increase. Mr. Hayes noted that he's speaking for 80% of folks in the Wilson District. Mr. Hayes is concerned with the tax assessment being \$4500 per acre when folks are buying it now for \$2-3,000 per acre. He feels that the assessment needs to be looked at very closely.

Mrs. Sarah Osborne, Independence, Virginia, spoke thanking the Board for their service and is in favor of the tax increase – we need to be able to provide fire/rescue, garbage, internet, etc. We have 500000 people that come through our county each year and we have the 3rd lowest tax rate in the state.

Ms. Debby Greif, Mouth of Wilson, Virginia, spoke regarding the budget and goals but are confused as to why the county would link money into a high tech facility in Baywood School which is deteriorating while at the same time cutting \$400,000 from our public education budget. Crossroads currently does the same thing. Priorities need to be focused on our current student and system before embarking on a whole new education system. Current schools, buses and technology is what we need money for. Ms Greif also noted that inflation is also affecting the teachers and would like to get back on the salary scale continuing with the yearly steps with eventually adjusting the salary scale to surrounding counties - currently the teachers salaries are significantly lower that the surrounding counties. Superintendent Wilmore and the School Board have assured the teachers that their salaries will be restored for the 19-20 school year and feel they can manage this even with a short-change funding due to the 5% that the governor approved for salaries this year. Even with that, the teachers are still not at a competive salary pay within our area so funding will need to be continued and maintained - not keep getting cut; six (6) teachers from the high school have left within the past five (5) months due to the low pay. Without the best teachers at the schools, it hurts the students.

Mr. Fred Weatherman, Independence, Virginia, spoke in favor of the tax increase but does have an issue with the county not collecting ALL the taxes owed. Mr. Weatherman noted that he pays his taxes so everyone else should as well. The county needs to do a better job of collecting the taxes.

Mr. Allen Faulkner, Fries, Virgina thanked the Board for their support for the Emergency Services Commission. Mr. Faulkner noted that currently if one of the members is injured, there is no workers comp coverage for them and asked the Board for their support and approving workers comp coverage for their members.

Supervisor Revels made the motion to close the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Hash. Motion carried 5-0.
